SILVER STRIKERS AUCTION PROTOCOL

- 1. Your club membership number will be your bidding number. In order to save time please pre-register at the Silver Strikers table on Wednesday and Thursday. You may also register at the entrance to the auction on Thursday night. If you plan to do so please be there early. Bidding paddle with your number will be at the table when you enter Thursday night. A listing and examination of lots for the auction will also be available.
- 2. There will be 31 lots and all will carry a 10% buyer's fee. Consignors will pay a 10% seller's fee. A 10% fee also goes to CC & GTCC. All remaining fees will be added to our club treasury.
- 3. IMPORTANT: SALES TAX: You may purchase an individual lot or you may run a tab and pay (including tax) at the conclusion of the auction. Nevada Sales Tax is due and will be collected on the total bid price plus the 10% buyer's fee on any lot delivered with the State of Nevada. Lot shipped out of state will not be charged Nevada Sales Tax. IF YOU HAVE A RESALE NUMBER, PLEASE SUBMIT A COPY TO EVELYN GROSKLAUS UPON ENTERING THE AUCTION ON THURSDAY EVENING. THOSE WITH RESALE NUMBERS DO NOT HAVE TO PAY TAX. ALL ACCOUNTS SHALL BE SETTLED AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE AUCTION.
- 4. If possible we ask that you PLEASE settle all your accounts on Thursday at the conclusion of the auction. If you cannot, please settle the account with Evelyn Grosklaus on Friday morning. Winning bidders who are also consignors may apply their purchase to their income and pay or receive the net difference.

THE ISSUE-WHAT IS A SILVER STRIKE?

This is a topic for the *Silver Strikers* business meeting on Thursday night at the convention. Due to the controversy over the definition of "what is a silver strike" I am requesting that those of you who have a definition they would like considered for adoption for the purpose of "Silver Strike of the Year" and "Hall of Fame" selection to forward YOUR wording to me by May 15th so a list of recommendations can be put into print for all to review and decide their vote. Discussion will still take place and parts of various definitions may be combined but some time limitations will be established so that other agenda items can be discussed.

This is the recommended definition produced by your officers for the 2001 competition:

DEFINED ONLY THOSE SILVER STRIKES PRODUCED UNDER THE SUPERVISION AND SOLD TO THE CASINO BY ANCHOR GAMING (NOW IGT) IN CONJUNCTION WITH THEIR PATENTED "SILVER STRIKE PROGRAM."

This doesn't mean the odds are better, just the opportunity is there. These machines are headed for the Aladdin, Bally's, Sam's Town, Flamingo and O'Shea's.

COLLECTING THE PATRIOTIC SILVER STRIKES

A new opportunity to assemble a collection of silver strikes with a patriotic theme is rapidly developing. Since September 11th our country has rallied to the support of the concept of patriotism in America. Several designs have appeared on silver strikes being issued in Las Vegas and other states. Several \$200 strikes have also been introduced in Las Vegas casinos.

These \$200 issues are from the Las Vegas Club, Plaza, Flamingo and the Imperial Palace. Currently there are 4 patriotic \$10 strikes from the Plaza, 3 from the Las Vegas Club, 4 from the Gold Coast, 3 from Bally's and 2 from the Imperial Palace. Artwork for several others has been approved and soon will be in play.



DID YOU HEAR ??

The Flamingo and O'Shea's will each produce a silver strike with the CC & GTCC (old logo) with a limited mintage of 750 each for the convention.

The Las Vegas Club will have a limited issue of 1000 CC & GTCC strikes with the new logo and the Union Plaza will produce a limited issue of 1000 with the Silver Striker logo.

All existing inventory from Trop World in Atlantic City has been destroyed.

The Peppermill, Reno; Sundowner, Reno; and the Sparks Nugget are working each have approved artwork.

The Paris in Las Vegas has put in a silver strike machine with 2 sets of 3 designs.

Harvey's Lake Tahoe has removed most of their machines but still have the last three strikes in play.

Binion's machines have been removed.

As soon as the old strikes are played through, Treasure Island and Slots of Fun will put their new strikes in play.

There will be new logos soon on the Reno/Tahoe Airport and Sierra Sid's strikes.

The McCarran airport will soon have five new designs in play to go with their largest number of silver strike machines in the state. Eleven machines!




3 vs. 2 BUTTON SKIER JACKET ON HARRAH'S RENO \$7 STRIKE

Actually there are 3 varieties which require a careful eye to provide the distinctions. There are two-2 button varieties, both with lines indicating valleys in the mountains. The difference between these two is found on the logo side where one will not have the "." in front of the .999 while the other does. The NO "." is the harder to come by. The common variety is the 3 button which is easily identified by the fact that the mountains are smooth. Another difference is that the 2 button variety has a lot more snow flying around above the skis. All three are part reeded.
