### PRESIDENT'S REMARKS

Just like the rest of you we are back home unpacking and getting our strikes catalogued and put away. May those of you who were not able to attend the convention this year get to so do next time.

Many of us who had signed up for the second Silver Strikers Tournament were in for a shock. The tournament was canceled about 10 days before it was to take place. I found that our fellow striker, Milton Sculky was a person who when faced with a lemon-made lemonade. Although he lives in New York he started calling the Las Vegas Club and made arrangements for us to have a room to trade in for the two days we would have otherwise been at the tournament. He first checked his plan out with the Officers and was given the go-ahead.

I was invited to attend the first Chapter Presidents' Meeting which was held jointly with the CC & GTCC Officers. There was a pledge of support on their part and a desire to work more closely with the Chapters. I felt that a move had been made in the right direction.

Prior to the business meeting your officers meet and go over the topics for the Silver Strikers meeting. We have been doing this since the beginning and it helps to make our meeting go more smoothly.

During the regular business meeting the members voted on a \$5.00 processing fee for all new memberships received after 1 July. We also voted that new members could sign up their spouses as an associate member at \$10.00. There would only be the \$5.00 processing fee for both of them. Without this change both would have paid the \$5.00 fee. I was felt that by doing this it would mean that both members could sign up and both are eligible for any tournaments for Silver Strikers members only.

A proposal to increase the cost of obtaining a roster from \$5.00 to \$8.00 passed. This was necessary due to an increase in postal rates and we have a membership of nearly 500 now.

The proposal to define silver strikes is still being worked on. Since both Rick Ronca of the Plaza and Freddie Maatouk of the Las Vegas Club made rooms available at \$20 for the Silver Strikers who no longer had rooms at the Flamingo, a motion was made to give each of these gentlemen a plaque. To pay for this a donation was taken a approximately \$130.00 was raised for this purpose.

Nominations were taken for new officers for next year. Don Nesbitt, Jr. was nominated for President. Sharon Pamperin, who brought in 23 new members this year was nominated for Secretary. Forms will be sent out at a future date so all can nominate a person of their choice for each of the Chapter Offices.

# SILVER STRIKERS CHAPTER

A chapter of the  
Casino Chips and Gaming Tokens Collectors Club

## CODE OF ETHICS

As a member of the Casino Chips & Gaming Tokens Collectors, I agree to abide by the following CC&GTCC Code of Ethics:

1. To support and be governed by the bylaws, rules, policies and regulations of the Club, as such rules may be amended from time to time.
2. To conduct myself so as to bring no discredit to the Club or to impair the prestige of the Club or its members.
3. To base all of my dealings on the highest plane of justice, fairness and morality.
4. Neither to buy nor sell any material of which the ownership is questionable.
5. To take immediate steps to correct any error I make in any transaction.
6. Not to sell, exhibit, produce nor advertise counterfeits, copies, reproductions or restrikes of any item unless their nature is clearly indicated as such.
7. To represent casino collectibles as genuine only when to the best of my knowledge and belief, such items are in fact authentic, and when no significant question of their authenticity has been raised.
8. To fulfill all contracts and agreements which I may make, either oral or written; to make prompt payment upon delivery; and to return immediately any item that is not satisfactory.
9. To furnish requested advice to the best of my ability and knowledge, and not to take advantage of superior knowledge on my part to the disadvantage of a less knowledgeable collector.
10. To offer on all sales and trades, a 10-day return privilege on any item purchased or traded, unless I have clearly and conspicuously stated that items are sold or traded "as is," and without a return privilege.
11. To refrain from making any unjustified, false, or slanderous comments about other members.
12. To abide by all local, state and federal laws and to assist in the prosecution of those who may violate such laws and regulations.
13. To cooperate fully with officers of the Club in investigating and resolving problems which may arise, and complaints which may be made, and to provide such information to such officers as may reasonably be requested.

### **DID YOU HEAR?**

Sierra Sid's in Sparks will put silver strikes in play in July that have a new logo dated 2002 but the designs will be the same 6 as in 2001.

The Silverton in Las Vegas issued 3 strikes dated 2002 and stating "Welcome to the millennium" which, it is rumored, will be removed on the second order.

Silver Strike machines are no longer in play at the Gold Country in Elko, Horseshoe, Flamingo, and O'Shea's in Las Vegas,

Three new strikes for Westward Ho in LV, all patriotic themes, are in play.

Caesar's, Las Vegas, has their \$40 strike in play. The long awaited \$200 strike from Caesar's I LV, will probably be destroyed and never be released. There is doubt as to the future of strikes with Park Place Ent. Casinos.

More strikes on their way: NY, NY (7-4 patriotic/3 sports) and McCarran Airport (5 patriotic).

Las Vegas Club has introduced five of their new Olympic series of 15 silver strikes. Each strike is limited to 1750 and will be the strikes needed to acquire the new \$200.

Palms Casino in Las Vegas will be installing two silver strike machines and are currently looking at 11 designs (4-cars/7 restaurants) Limited quantities ranging from 600 to 1000 are expected, and 2 \$200 strikes are also proposed. Give it two months to happen!

Reno airport is having a logo change. Not clear if the change will be on existing strikes.

## **"YELLOW" HIGHLIGHTED ADDRESS LABEL?**

Please check your address label on the Newsletter. If it is "highlighted" in yellow, this is a reminder that your membership dues for the Silver Strikers Chapter are due!

Any member that fails to pay his or her renewal fee by the date shown on their mailing label and membership card (this is due the first of the month in which you joined) will be automatically granted a thirty (30) day extension. Delinquency after the 30 day extension will result in the membership being canceled, membership number retired, name removed from the roster and rejoining subject to the \$5.00 processing fee.
