NEW SERIES INTRODUCED AT CAESAR'S TAHOE

Caesar's Hotel and Casino at Lake Tahoe have brought the silver strike collectors several great strikes over the years. Remember the \$200 Cleopatra which sold to a collector for about \$10,000! This is the casino that brought us the only Hot August Nights strike (2001-ltd. 1000) issued. Also last year, Caesar's introduced a new series of strikes, including a delightful concept of "four in one," where the four regular silver strikes were summarized on the limited issue (777) strike. It was the first time the number of mintage amounted

to "777." Both the Hot August Nights and "four in one" strikes were in the finalists for "Silver Strike of the Year 2001." The \$200 strike is in the Hall of Fame!

A creative management has found several ways to satisfy the appetite of the collector, as well as, create the special souvenir for the tourist. Now, Caesar's has done it again, introducing five new strikes, one being limited to "777" in quantity. The new issues depict various outdoor action sporting opportunities found at Lake Tahoe. Skiing, hand gliding, snow boarding and rock climbing are represented in fresh artwork. The limited issue is once again a "four in one" strike showing the four sporting topics. There are two of the limited strikes in each fill of fifty which makes them a challenge to obtain but worth the effort.

The new strikes are to be in the machines by December. All of the previous series will be retired and only the new ones in the machines. There are two machines in play at Caesar's, so bring a friend.

PATRIOTIC STRIKES KEEP GROWING IN NUMBERS!

The patriotic theme continues to expand its availability. Since September 11, 2001, our country has rallied to the support of the concept of patriotism in America. Four \$200 strikes have been introduced from the following Las Vegas Casinos: Palms, Plaza, Flamingo and Slots-A-Fun.

In addition there have been 59 \$10 strikes make the scene thus far: 4 from the Plaza, 2 from the Las Vegas Club, 4 from the Gold Coast, 3 from Bally's, 2 from the Imperial Palace, 5 from the Barbary Coast, 3 from the Paris, 2 from the Orleans, 2 from the Golden Nugget, 2 from the Flamingo LV, 3 from O'Shea's, 6 from the Silverton, 5 from the Luxor, 4 from the Slots-A-Fun, 4 from the Suncoast, 4 from New York New York, 3 from the Sundowner Reno, 1 from the Sparks Nugget and 1 from the Peppermill Reno.

DID YOU HEAR?

Sparks Nugget is going to put into play a new \$10 and \$200 silver strike in early Dec. They both will feature the famous Golden Rooster. The \$200 will be available for ANY 20-Nugget \$10 strikes.

Four Queens in Las Vegas is interested in putting back their strike machines BUT there are no machines available at this time.

Sierra Sid's is planning to offer a \$200 silver strike soon depicting the Reno Arch. They can be obtained by trading 20 of the 2001 or 2002 series. They are planning on introducing a new \$10 strike, which will be the artwork of the pony express rider as found on last year's one pounders.

Boomtown, Verdi, Silver Club, Sparks and Mandalay Bay, LV, are to pull their machines or have pulled them.

Mr. B's, Mill City, new strike with a covered wagon by mid-Nov.

Silver Legacy in Reno issues 7th anniversary has a new look – the Hotel.

Mirage in LV has 7 machines – 3/\$10 strikes and 3/\$40 strikes! Takes 20-\$10 strikes to trade for the \$200.

Slots-A-Fun has introduced 4 new \$10 strikes and a \$200, which can be obtained by the 20 for 1 program.

The total minimum silver strike order for a casino from IGT is: 1750 strikes for a \$10 and 250 for a \$200. Otherwise, the casino pays die charges.

NEW SILVER STRIKE MACHINE

IGT (international Gaming Technology) debuted the next generation of Silver Strike Machines at the 2002 Global Gaming Expo held this past September in Las Vegas. All of those who attended had the chance to see, touch, feel and play the new machines. The new machine is built on IGT's S2000 model slot machine. We have all seen this model; it is the one with the little (about 2 inches square) "bunny ears" speakers attached on the side of the machine just above the reel level.

The overall display has the new machine placed on a black pedestal, a four/six inch chrome tube on each side extending from the base to up above the machine supporting another black box on the top. The upper box contained an electrical display sign telling what the machine was and on top of the upper box were two large (about 10/12 inches in diameter and 4 inches thick) rotating Silver Strikes models.


The machine itself looks like any other reel machine from the bottom up to the top of the reels. Just above the reels is the top of the main case and from this point is an all-new upper case housing the displays and prize dispensing mechanism. I say prize because this is a generic machine designed to be used in dispensing prizes, not just strikes but possibly many different prizes. With different markings it may dispense jewelry, pins, lighters, etc., items other than strikes.

The upper case is almost as big as the lower case. In the middle at about eye level of the upper case is the dispensing mechanism, which is a 12/14-inch diameter 15/18-inch tall vertical cylinder that rotates when you win. The rotating cylinder contains six vertical 3-inch tubes, which hold the prize containers, now know as "Hockey Pucks". Each of the six 3-inch tubes holds 16 prize containers. Each 3-inch tube has an opening running top to bottom so you can see how many prize containers remain in that tube. Each tube has a display window above it displaying what is in the prize containers in that particular tube. All of this mechanism is behind a curved piece of glass (plastic?) so you can see it turn

and dispense the prize container. When you win a catchy tune starts playing and the cylinder starts turning. After one or two rotations the cylinder will stop with one of the 3-inch tubes facing the front of the machine. At this point the music stops, a drum roll starts and the mechanism starts dropping the container out of the tube. The container drops into a slot below that is designed to allow the container to slide out to the front where the player can retrieve it. The audible drum roll is timed so that it reaches it's crescendo just as the container appears in the retrieval slot. On each side of the curved glass are three more, total of six, display windows showing what is in the prize containers. The entire display is very impressive, looks very good and was liked by all that studied it. The machine is labeled a Silver Strike machine. The reels contain the words Silver Strike and when you line up three Silver Strikes you are a winner. The colors are black, royal blue, silver, chrome and white with heavy use of lights.

Everyone I spoke with felt the new machine looked great, was a good start and would be a welcome change. The trial machine did not have all of the features that we strike collectors have come to expect. This machine was not set up to offer multiple payouts. IGT has thought about making it such that the player could select from which tube they wanted the prize dispensed. The hockey puck container will not fit in well with the collector, it needs changes, you can not see both sides of the strike while in the unopened container, storage will be a bigger problem and it will be harder to ship.

The new machine as seen at the Gaming Expo was a generic prize-dispensing machine but <u>IGT will make some modifications so it can be a strike specific dispensing machine (no puck holder).</u> I think it is very doable and everyone had ideas on how to make it better. Now we'll just have to wait and see what the final product looks like.

THE \$200 SILVER STIKE BECOMES A STAR

Silver strikes began their existence in 1992 with a few machines, which dispensed a silver \$7 token as a jackpot prize. They proved to be an accounting nightmare so in 1994, the \$10 silver strike came onto the scene. These strikes were and are the prize of a 25-cent machine. In 1995, a \$5 per pull machine was introduced in five Nevada casinos: Bally's, LV; Eldorado, Reno; Harrah's, Lake Tahoe; Fitzgerald's, Reno and the Imperial Palace, LV. The players quickly became far and few but Caesars at Tahoe thought maybe their high rollers would go for the \$200 strike. After only a couple of months, that machine was also pulled and the remainder of the shipment returned. The other casinos sold off their remaining inventory at the cashier's cages. The Eldorado had two different designs produced before they called it quits; a walking eagle and the Brew Brothers. Bally's had a die change, which resulted in two distinct varieties.

That's the way it was up to 1998, when the Imperial Palace had the idea of trading 20 \$10 strikes for a \$200. At the end of 1999, the Eldorado produced \$200 strikes and sold them through their gift shop for \$375. This was not the use the Gaming Commission envisioned for these tokens, and after only one shipment of 25 strikes in 2001, this concept was discontinued.

In 2000, the Union Plaza, LV, adopted the concept of the trading of 20-\$10 strikes for the \$200. In 2001, the Las Vegas Club; Oshea's, LV; and the Flamingo, LV joined the Plaza and adopted the same concept. At this point it would take 17 strikes to have a full collection.

Additional strikes were issued in 2002 by: the Flamingo, LV; the Union Plaza, LV; Slot-A-Fun, LV; Mirage, LV; Las Vegas Club; and the Palms, LV. There will be a second \$200 strike from the Palms. All await the issuing of \$200 strikes from: Sierra Sid's and the Nugget in Sparks.

THE .999 "ON THE RIM" ERRORS

In the latter part of 1996, the Nevada Gaming Commission required that the .999 silver designation on silver strikes be placed on the silver center of the token. Before that date, the .999 designation was found on the brass ring. The commission felt that this was misleading to the public and, hence, the change. As a result of this change, there has been 3 silver strikes issued with the .999 on the rim producing an interesting error.

San Remo, LV Millennium issued 1999 value \$400+ Reno Flamingo Tiger issued 1998 value \$100+ Riverside, Laughlin (98-99) issued 1998 value \$1000+

Keep your eyes open as who knows if there is another one of these errors out there. Not many of any of these!!
