

SILVER STRIKE MARKET ANALYSIS

Your views are welcome and wanted – on the silver strike market overall, a denomination, a casino, or specific strike. Send your thoughts to the editor. These are the thoughts of Jack Haddock on the status of the current silver strike market.

In the beginning, a \$10 strike would cast the collector between \$12 and \$14 to win depending on how many the player cashed in at face value. Of course, casinos would trade and, sometimes, even sell them from the cage for the \$10.Ah, the good old days. Now the casinos either mix up the strikes in the payout shoots of the new strike machines or perhaps, put old strikes in with new. No more trading, with few exceptions. So now the strikes cost closer to \$18, especially when trying to put a set of 6 together and having to cash in the ones you can't use.

Collectors fear the 1750 mintage number required by IGT for the casinos to avoid paying the die charge but many casinos take the strike production far past that number which bring the scarcity value basically back to face. Some of the earlier strikes found in our collections belong to defunct casinos which mean there is no redemption value – just the collector value which is quite often under \$20.

When all the facts are reviewed, even though the \$10 strike is the most collected, their values have generally decreased over the last several years. Many large collections have sold and other consolidated to more precise areas of interest. Though the \$200 silver strike remains popular after being discontinued several months age, their resale value has remained fairly stable. This is unlike the other discontinued denominations like \$7, \$20, and \$40, which have declined, in recent months. The inability to add to these collections has probably prompted several collectors to sell off these retired issues. The reduced interest along with available material has resulted in the decrease in value.

The market situation of the strikes that have a defined limited production is a study unto itself. That would be a great topic for YOU!!



Since I have the big birthday next week, I have an excuse for forgetting the larger denominations strikes from Southern Mississippi in the last article. I'll cover those before I go over the Grand Generics. I have also misplaced last month's newsletter so I might repeat the \$40's from Casino Magic in Bay St Louis.

The Grand Casino in Biloxi and Gulfport had 5 \$20. strikes. They were one piece silver with no colored rim, no mint mark or dollar value. They are Assayer, Panner, Pony Express, Stagecoach and Train. The Grand also offered 8 \$40. strikes. The first three were dated 1996 and depicted the Louisiana State Seal, Mississippi State Seal and Texas State Seal. The other five are a hard to find set dated 1997 which consists of the Lighthouse, Pelican, Magnolia, Dolphins and Shrimp Boat.

Treasure Bay in Biloxi had 4 \$40. strikes but only two faces with 2 different logos. Logo 1 is no dollar value and Logo 2 is \$40. redeemable. The faces are Pirate with Swords and Walk the Plank.

Now that I've got myself caught up, we'll go to the Grand Generics. These strikes were used in all the Grand Casinos in Mississippi and Louisiana. We have documented over 80 \$10. strikes from The Grand. They started in 1994 with the Gamblers series. That set of four came coin aligned and medallion aligned. 1994 also brought us the 5 piece Mardi Gras set which is Bourbon Street, Building, King of Carnival, Mardi Gras and Sax Player. The last set for 1994 was the Hollywood Classics. This set of 8 pictures movie stars such as Bogart, Davis, Fields, Gable, Laurel and Hardy, Marx, Monroe and Wayne. This set has the actor's name next to the image. I have found a few in both large and small font. 1995 started with the Gamblers series again with coin aligned and medallion aligned variations. Then on to the Mardi Gras series dated 1995. Now they get tricky on us. They released the Hollywood Classics with 3 face variations. They all have the 1995 logo. I'll use Humphrey Bogart as an

example. One variation has his image with his name and limited edition on the rim. Another has his image with no name and limited edition on the rim. The last has his image with no name and ten dollar redeemable on the rim. All 8 of the Hollywood Classics come with these 3 variations. The last series in 1995 was the Wildlife set of four which is the same old Buffalo, Deer, Eagle and Horses that we've grown to love. Yeah right!! They knew we loved it so much, they started off 1996 with the same set but, at least, they changed the date on the logo. Someone must have been pretty bored or lazy because they then duplicated the Gamblers series and the Hollywood Classic series. Sometime in 1996, someone really scored big in my book and put some thought and design into this last set of four strikes. They are very detailed and are signed by the artist. They show Bear Cubs, a Duck, an Eagle and a Moose. This is a great set and used to bring pretty good prices. I haven't seen any sell lately but are a set worth collecting. None of the Grand generics have a mint mark.

That's about it for the Grand Generics. I know there are probably still generics we haven't found or isn't listed in Dennis' and my book. Please let me know if you have any I haven't mentioned. See you all in August and happy
